Annexation

Editor, Torrance Herald: The City of Torrance is big—but its Mayor, City Council, and City Manager are never quite satisfied—they want more and more power and prestige.

Torrance already has a problem of adequately servicing its own existing area and despite its high tax rate it is hard pressed to meet its obligations without raising more funds.

Recently, a story appeared in the Torrance papers lamenting the heavy work load and long hours which the present City Council must work in order to take care of its business. At first there was a temptation to weep with them, but now we find them wanting still more work by the addition of more territory. An area of Lawndale has been selected as desirable to annex to Torrance. Following this, we are told that portions of Lomita are looked upon with a benevolent eye.

The former all American City is out to take all of America it can get. Has the City of Torrance ever heard of the Good Neighbor policy or the adage "Live and let live"?

But an alert citizenry in Lawndale can make this look exceedingly bad for Torrance if they get out and work.

As for Lomita, we do not know of a single organization favoring annexation to Torrance. The Lomita Chamber of Commerce, the Lomita property owners and registered voters, etc., are all opposed. After all, taxes are already

If you do not have sufficient water under proper pressure for sanitation and fire protection you can be sure of correcting this by signing the petition now being circulated for joining 13. An assessment district would be set up and bonds would be sold for the purpose of replacing the old mains. The sooner property owners sign the petition the sooner work can start on this very essential improvement.

One question is, What is the true status of Narbonne Ranch Water No. 2. It is a private company or a mutual company? If a mutual company (and Mr. Cook says it will take a vote of the stockholders) then the controlling voice in the company are the people themselves who own property. Originally, one vote of stock was issued to every one acre of land.

Torrance has expressed interest in buying No. 2. Their interest is not so much in the company as in an attempt to get a foothold and to annex the area.

A few people are suggesting incorporation as a city and then the new city buying and improving the water company.
