**Gibson Asks Help With LA Signals**

Public assistance in restoring proper operation of traffic signals, which may be functioning improperly for a variety of causes, has been requested by City Council President John S. Gibson.

Gibson asked that anyone noting a Los Angeles street signal so affected call the Southern District Traffic office at the San Pedro City Hall or on the direct TE 4-8765 extension.

This request was made, the Councilman said, following a periodic study of signals in the Southern District by Traffic Engineer M. C. Olson. District headquarters are maintained at the Wilmington Branch City Hall, 413 Neptune Ave.

Signals in the area which are out of synchronization because of power failure, or other reasons, must be manually reset to again function in proper cycle, Olson stated. Although he and his staff are continuously inspecting the signals, some are apt to go unnoticed for several hours unless reported. Reports of these discrepancies can expedite materially the return to normal operating procedure, the traffic engineer said.

Inquiries and information on all other traffic problems in the 15th councilmanic district also are handled by the district office in Wilmington, Councilman Gibson advised.

**Cancer Fighters Names to Go to Mrs. Eisenhower**

Signatures of 1,000,000 cancer fighters from Los Angeles County will be flown to Mrs. Dwight D. Eisenhower, honorary national chairman of the American Cancer Society, as evidence of the scope of the local Crusade which commences April 1, it was reported today by Laraine Day.

"Our April Crusade kit will be used as a roster to sign up everyone who makes a contribution of either time, knowledge or money to strike back at the disease that last year killed 22,000 Californians," explained Miss Day, who is this year's honorary memorial crusade chairman for Los Angeles County.

Mrs. L. H. Montgomery, residential chairman of L. A. County, looked on as Miss Day demonstrated with an enlargement of the cancer fighters roll how signatures will be gathered from Torrance and the remainder of the county to swell the ranks of those who are helping to conquer cancer.
