


FRONT OFFICE HONORS

Local Boxer's Record Impressive Babe Ruth Loop In Southern California Campaign Extends Tryouts

"Torrance will give the fight game a new heavyweight hope and my guess the next world's champion," said Manager Gordon Shaw when interviewed by the HERALD sports editor yesterday. "The boy is Roy Smith," continued Shaw, "and out of 14 fights he has won 10—two of them by KO's and drew Friday night."

Smith fought Bob Smith (no relation) in the second spot of this week's card at the Long Beach Auditorium and the judges voted it an even contest.

Shaw, who has been handling Roy Smith since he turned pro, said that he felt his boxer would have won his last bout if the fight had been over the six-round route. He qualified this by saying that Smith is naturally a slow starter and four rounds does not give him a chance to really get going, despite his record of wins—all four-round matches.

The 183-pound fighter, who lives at 1205 Fern Ave., is ready for "the full distance" and his manager is negotiating for a match with Lamar Clark, Salt Lake City heavyweight, on the card to be held in Palm Springs April 4.

Smith dethroned Cliff Hawkins at the Auditorium March 10 in a fight that had fans demanding his return on the Beach city's bi-monthly card.

The 24-year-old local boxer is from North Carolina and now works for the California Material Co. in Hawthorne. He is serious about the fight business, and has been since he won a Golden Gloves tournament in 1957, Shaw concluded.
