




NOTICE OF ABANDONMENT AND SALE
WHEREAS, on March 17, 1959, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 3646 declaring its intention to vacate and abandon Lot P-6 of the Torrance Tract, more particularly described as follows:
Lot P-6 of the Torrance Tract as recorded in Map Book 22, Pages 84 and 85 of Records in the office of the County Recorder, County of Los Angeles, State of California; and
WHEREAS, the City Council thereupon elected to abandon said land which was purportedly dedicated to the City for park purposes, under the provisions of Article 15, Part 2, Division 3, Title 4 of the Government Code of the State of California; and
WHEREAS, on April 22, 1959, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 3668 ordering the abandonment and sale of said land to vacant.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that subject to the reservations and exceptions contained in said Resolution No. 3646 to wit:
THAT the City of Torrance will receive and except from said vacant all permanent easements and the right at any time from time to time, to maintain, operate, replace, remove, alter, improve, extend, and repair, sewers and storm drains and appurtenant structures in, upon, over and across said parcel of land, and to maintain, operate, replace, remove, alter, improve, extend, and repair, lines of pipe, conduits, cables, trusses, poles, and other convenient structures, equipment and fixtures for the operation of gas pipe lines, telegraphic and telephone lines, for the transportation or distribution of petroleum and its products, and water, including access and the right to erect and construct, protect, maintain and improve, all necessary materials and wood ed grounds and other works, the same from all hazards in, upon and over the park or part thereof, proposed to be vacated.

All of said park shall be abandoned and all the City's right, title and interest in and to said land shall be sold the highest bidder for a cash price not less than \$100. Bids will be received in the office of the City Clerk until 5:00 o'clock p.m. Tuesday, May 5, 1959, and will be publicly opened in the Council Chambers of the City Hall of the City of Torrance on May 5, 1959, at 2:30 p.m.
