... Whips Up Batter

English Recipes Handed Down to Torrance Woman

Descended from generations of Englishmen, Mrs. Myron Spaulding, newly elected charter president of Hamilton P.T.A., prides herself on her original English recipes for roast beef with Yorkshire pudding and "Snapdragons" which were passed down by her ancestors to her own London-born mother.

The first member of her family to be born in this country, Mrs. Spaulding, who makes her home at 18513 Spinning St., has resided in this area for the past eight years. A native of Cleveland, she came to California 18 years ago, where she lived in the High Sierras in the Mother Lode country just outside of Placerville.

Active in P.T.A. work for the past 19 years, the new Hamilton president received an honorary life award last February for her work with young people. Prior to activating Hamilton P.T.A., she belonged to Arlington P.T.A. She is also a member of the North High P.T.A. board, was area captain for the March of Dimes this year, and has been active in Red Cross and Cub Scouts.

Mrs. Spaulding is the mother of five—three daughters and twin sons—and has two grandchildren.

Her two favorite English recipes are as follows:

Yorkshire Pudding

- 1 standing rib roast
- 1 cup milk
- or rolled rib roast
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup flour
- Pinch of salt

Cook the roast in an uncovered pan at 350 degrees for as long as necessary according to size of roast. While the roast is cooking, prepare batter for the Yorkshire pudding with the remaining ingredients. Beat vigorously till smooth. One-half hour before the roast is done, remove it from the oven and pour 1/2 cup of the roast beef drippings into an iron frying pan. Pour the batter over the drippings and place it in a very hot oven, 425 to 450 degrees, for 25 minutes. When the pudding is done, it will have risen twice as high as the pan and will be golden brown in color.

Snapdragons

A fun-recipe for the Yuletide season in Merry England, snapdragons are traditional in the Spaulding household. Even the children get in on the preparations. All that is required is a large shallow dish, a box of raisins, and 3/4 of a cup of brandy. Separate the largest raisins and spread them over the surface of the shallow bowl. Pour the brandy over and let the raisins soak it up for about a minute. Then shut out all the lights, put a match to it, and eat the flaming raisins.
