

# California Bank Opens New IRC Plan

California Bank's "Insured Ready Cash" plan (IRC) is available at the Torrance branch. Manager George Post reminded Torrance area residents this week.

The plan, adopted by California Bank after careful study of a number of outstanding credit plans across the nation, was announced last week by Frank L. King, president of the bank.

THE PLAN, as inaugurated by California Bank, includes a revolving consumer credit account including life insurance, according to the original announcement.

IRC creates an actual deposit credit account for the customer against which he may cash checks any time for any purpose. The maximum amount the customer may apply for is limited only to the amount he may properly service.

A STATEMENT is mailed monthly showing interest charges only on the amount that has actually been used, plus a small charge for each check cashed.

An important feature of IRC is that the balance owing is fully covered by life insurance. The applicant does not have to be a customer of the bank, Post pointed out.

IN THE MEANTIME Engineer Bob Weir had stopped his locomotive a few feet away and climbed down from the cab. He was shaken from the effort it took to halt the heavy freight train, but still felt it his duty to warn Mrs. Noaks of the danger of children getting on the right-of-way.

Other neighbors in the area told the HERALD that this was not the first near-accident when children strayed to the open railroad tracks and one expressed hope that the line be fenced in this dangerous area.
