South High School Opens Monday; Signals Scheduled at Calle Moyer

Students will move into the new South High buildings as school resumes next Monday, with classes slated from 8 a.m. to 2:50 p.m.
Students have been attending classes in Torrance Elementary and Torrance High School pending completion of the new building, on Pacific Coast Hwy., east of Calle Mayor. School officials completed the move into the new facilities over Christmas vacation.
Buses will provide transportation for students who live more than two miles from school.
Signal Planned
School officials have been informed that a signal at the busy crossing at Calle Mayor and Pacific Coast Hwy. should be ready by the middle of February. In the meantime, however, crossing protection will be furnished by the Torrance Police Department.
School officials warned stu-

dents who must cross Pacific Coast Hwy. to do so at the intersection with Calle Mayor and also urged them to avoid walking along the side of the highway.
The state currently is studying plans for building an overcrossing in front of the school.
The opening of South High School will have no effect on the starting time, bus routes, or bus stops for Torrance and North High Schools.

The successful bidder shall be required to furnish a Faithful Performance Bond in an amount equal to 100% of the contract price. The bond shall be secured from surety companies satisfactory to the Board of Education.
The Board of Education reserves the right to reject any and all bids or to waive any irregularities in any bid, and to determine the lowest responsible bidder. No bidder may withdraw his bid, check or bid bond for a period of thirty (30) days after the date set for the opening thereof.
