Harbor Savings and Loan Opens Redondo Beach Office

With the opening of the Harbor Savings and Loan Assn. this week, South Redondo Beach will have its first insured savings and loan institution.

In announcing the establishment of Harbor Savings, President Joseph A. Wall declared, "the new savings and loan association will fill a long felt need for our service for the people living in South Redondo Beach, Palos Verdes, Hollywood Riviera, and peninsula districts."

New Office Planned "Our present offices at 1613 So. Pacific Coast Hwy.," Wall continued, "are temporary. Plans call for the erecting of a large building on the lot adjoining our temporary offices within the next 90 days."

The permanent building, Wall said, is scheduled to be completed in July.

Wall pointed out that Harbor Savings and Loan Assn. is a member of the Federal Home Loan Bank and all savings in the association are insured up to \$10,000 by the Federal Savings and Loan Corporation, an instrumentality of the United States Government.

4 Per Cent Interest The current interest rate on insured savings accounts, Wall said, is 4 per cent paid four times a year, or every three months.

In addition, emphasized Wall, Harbor Savings is managed by long time residents of the South Bay area.

A former president of the Redondo Beach Chamber of Commerce, E. J. Champion is chairman of the board of directors of Harbor Savings. He also is a partner in the Redondo Beach real estate firm of Champion-Armont and a former sales executive with Kellogg Foods of Battle Creek.

President Named President of Harbor Savings is Joseph A. Wall, who has been associated with two savings and loan associations in Los Angeles County during the last eight years. He was a vice president in his last post.

Prior to this work, Wall was in the residential home construction business. He was

graduated from Niagara University in economics.

Another university graduate with specialized financial training is Director George W. Schneider, Orange County land developer. He specialized in banking and finance at Marquette and then for years was an auditor for the Bank of America and Union Bank & Trust Co.

G. A. "Jerry" Herfurth, Redondo Beach automobile dealer, is vice president and secretary of the new association.

Dentist Named A dentist, Dr. Henry M. Ure, is assistant secretary. He practices in Manhattan Beach and lives in Palos Verdes.

Another Palos Verdes resident is J. H. Skidmore, Harbor Savings assistant treasurer, who is a vice president of Virtue Brothers Manufacturing Co., of Westchester.

Harbor Savings treasurer is Foster A. Day, owner of White & Day Mortuary which serves the South Bay area. Day also has a substantial interest in the Pacific Crest Cemetery, Redondo.

Other officers are B. D. Moulton, assistant vice president, and Mrs. Dorothy Killier, assistant secretary.
