

'Christian Code' Is Sunday Topic Of Rev. Kuester

The Rev. Earl Kuester, pastor of Calvary Baptist Church, 2818 Manhattan Beach Blvd., will speak on "A Christian Code of Attitude and Action" at the duplicate services 8:30 and 11 a.m.

The Lord's Supper will be observed with the Right Hand of Fellowship given to all new members of the past month. In the evening at 7:30 p.m. Kuester will continue his request sermons, speaking on "Prayer and the Divine Presence."

Tonight, the Adult Bible Class will hold a pot-luck dinner with the film "God of Creation" for the program which follows. All Sunday school teachers of adult age are invited to the dinner and program.

'Christ Jesus' Named Topic This Sunday

The Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, Sunday will be on the topic of the Master and Saviour, "Christ Jesus."

The Golden Text is in Jesus' words as recorded by John (18:37), "To this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth."

It is related in Luke's Gospel that John the Baptist, doubting, sent two of his disciples to ask, "Art thou he that should come? or look we for another?" Jesus answered by healing works, and said, "Go . . . and tell John what things ye have seen and heard; how that the blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, to the poor the gospel is preached" (7:19, 22).

This reference from Luke's Gospel is correlated in part by a passage from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" where Mary Baker Eddy declares, "The mission of Jesus confirmed prophecy, and explained the so-called miracles of olden time as natural demonstrations of the divine power, demonstrations which were not understood. Jesus' works established his claim to the Messiahship" (p. 131).






