### Program for New Teachers Set at USC

Urgent need for elementary and secondary school teachers has prompted the renewal of a pilot program for those not formally prepared but who may wish to begin teaching next September.

The plan is announced by the school of education at the University of Southern California in cooperation with the public school districts in the Los Angeles area, according to Dean Irving Melbo.

Both men and women holding bachelor's degrees are selected to qualify for the provisional credential, which permits salaried service while completing additional teacher training requirements. A similar program for junior college teaching is provided for those holding master's degrees.

Applications for training, which begins June 23 at SC, are now being accepted by Dr. Stuart F. McComb, coordinator in the school of education.
