Student Enrolls at ECC Clad in Garb of Yorubas

"Boyhood dreams, and five years of penny-pinching work in his native Africa to make them come true."

That's the heart of the story told by Sadiq Shitta-Bey, 24, as he stepped on to the El Camino College campus this week clad in the garb of his Yoruba tribe, to begin study in America toward an engineering degree.

Bey, as a boy, lived in Lagos, capital of Nigeria, on the great inner bend of the west coast of Africa. There he developed an admiration for America and a hope that he could go there sometime.

At 19 the native of Africa left his family, mother, brother and four married sisters, and went north to Monrovia, capital of Liberia. There he worked as clerk in a shipping company office and studied to determine how he could gain

admittance to some American college. An El Camino publication came to hand, he liked what it said about the college, and he came here—by ship to New Orleans and rail to Los Angeles.

Lands in New Orleans

Bey arrived in New Orleans in company of twin Nigerians who are enrolling at East Contra Costa College in the San Francisco Bay area. Their ship docked on Feb. 20. He noted that the reactions of Southern Californians have been much more cordial than those in the South.

While attending El Camino classes, Bey is making his home in Hermosa Beach with the Christian Van Ettinger family.

When he arrived on campus, Bey wore an ankle-length habit of smooth hard cloth, a knee-length poncho-like garment but-

toned up the front, and a peaked cap with triangular flaps at the sides. Cap and outer garment were of the same material, a stout cotton cloth striped in many colors. "The flaps of the cap," he said in flawless English, "were designed to protect the ears in cold weather."

Retain Native Dress

The engineering major plans to retain his native dress while completing his college work.

Bey quit his job and left for America before he could save enough money to pay his way entirely through engineering school, and he plans to work part-time as he studies. For his purpose he hopes to make use of his experience in stenotyping. He expects to return to Africa to live after getting his degree and, perhaps, working awhile as an engineer in America.
