1. Ordinance prohibiting any new grass root wells within 300 feet of the center line of Hawthorne Avenue between Del Amo Boulevard and 230th St.
2. Ordinance amending Appendix I of the Code of the City of Torrance, 1954 (the Land Use Ordinance No. 791):
