Torrance Red Cross Drive Hits 38 Per Cent of Goal

Wrapping up a 38 per cent score with a total of \$2304, Mrs. Mary Pajac and her Red Cross residential volunteers were campaigning vigorously hoping to push total returns well past the half-way mark in raising their \$6000 goal by the end of the month.

The local fund raising team took fourth place among Southern region communities, according to the mid-campaign report issued this week by John Cunningham, regional chairman, Gardena — with the first over-the-top report of 102 per cent, was followed by San Pedro and Wilmington with respective goal intakes of 79 per cent and 62 per cent.

Calling upon Torrance residents to help volunteers accelerate the pace "of this most crucial campaign, by responding with generous contribution," Chairman Dr. Don Moshes indicated that "the fast growing Southland has thrown a heavier burden on the region's Red Cross blood service program through which whole

blood is provided without charge to southland hospitals. "This is only one of 10 Red Cross services which must be guaranteed adequate financing for the next year," said the chairman in urging residents to meet their responsibility in helping to keep the Red Cross "on the job!"
