

Local Church Revival Will Start Sunday

From time to time the Department of Employment reviews all claim records and the work application of an unemployment insurance claimant. This "Periodic Eligibility Review" is for the purpose of going over the work application with the claimant and

discussing with him the kinds of work he is able to accept and is seeking.

The interviewer also reviews the claimant's plan to find work and the efforts he has made to find work, to be sure that these are reasonable in view of the labor market situation at the time. The eligibility review is held at an-

other than the regular window and takes longer than the regular weekly interviews.

Another type of interview that may be required is the "determination interview."

Whenever there is any question as to whether the claimant meets all the eligibility requirements for unemployment insurance, it is necessary for the interviewer to write down the facts and circumstances of the case and

arrive at a decision on eligibility.

The reason for this process is twofold: (1) If the claimant is found eligible and payment is to be made, the record of his statements and the other facts protects him and his

right to have the payment, and (2) if he is found to be ineligible and payment cannot be made, the written notice protects his right to file an appeal.
