## American-Standard Appoints Douglas Baldwin as Manager

Douglas P. Baldwin has been named plant manager of American-Standard in Torrance. He succeeds L. N. Gill, who died March 23 while on a business trip to Italy.

The firm also named Lowell A. Bunnell as superintendent of manufacturing at the local

plant, the position formerly held by Baldwin.

The 38-year-old plant manager was born in Roseland, N. J., and was graduated from Rutgers with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Ceramics. Following a tour of duty in the U. S. Navy during World War II, he joined American-Standard in 1946 as a ceramic engineer at the Trenton plant.

Baldwin came to the San Pablo plant in 1947 and then to Torrance in 1948. He became general foreman here Jan. 1, 1957 and was promoted to superintendent of manufacturing Aug. 31, 1957.

Bunnell, who is 35, transferred from American-Standard's New Orleans plant to Torrance and assumed his new duties Tuesday.

Originally from Medina, N. Y., he was graduated by Alfred University with a degree in Ceramic Engineering and then served in the U. S. Air Force. He joined American-Standard in 1955.
