'Youth, Narcotics' Named Speech Topic

Henry B. Hall, executive secretary of the Narcotic Educational Foundation of America, will speak on "Youth and Narcotics," Sunday evening at 7:30 p.m. in the Torrance Hope Evangelical-United Brethren Church, 3343 W. 174th Street.

Hall, an authority on narcotics and crime prevention, states there was a major crime in America last year every 13.3 seconds, and although moral citizens do not commit these crimes, they are necessarily often the victims. Hall further states that narcotics are responsible for one-half of all crimes in metropolitan areas and everyone shares the cost and the danger that results.

The Torrance Ministerial Assn. is sponsor. Rev. Monrad Bergeson is the pastor of the church.

Hall has served as the executive secretary of the Narcotic Educational Foundation of America since 1941. He has talked to youthful offenders and studied their problems and has likewise interviewed parents, peddlers, ministers, doctors, judges, statesmen.
