

## 4 Local Bus Drivers Will Enter Rodeo

Four Torrance bus drivers including last year's champion, will compete in the sixth annual Southern California School Bus Rodeo at Hollywood Park, Inglewood, Saturday.

Representing the Torrance Unified School District will be Wayne Brnum, 3139 W. 178th St.; James M. Hobbs, 2475 W. 236th Pl., and Ted Stafford, 21409 Anza Way.

Brnum was named California State Champion School Bus Driver in the 1957 rodeo competition.

Also entered in the rodeo is Pat Desmond Jr., 4514 Scott St., who will be driving for the Los Angeles Board of Education.

Sponsored by the California School Employees Assn. in cooperation with the Greater Los Angeles Safety Council and other organizations concerned with school bus safety, the rodeo will have more than 140 entries representing school districts and private bus contractors throughout Southern California.

## Torrance Entered As 'Typical City'

Torrance is being considered as a candidate for the "typical American city" to be presented abroad over the U. S. Information Agency's Voice of American program.

In a letter to Robert T. Tibbets, executive vice president of the U. S. Junior Chamber of Commerce, city boosters presented Torrance qualifications for the honor.

A city of 100,000 persons which has solved its growth problems in an orderly fashion and which is a "melting pot" for various races and national backgrounds is sought for the "typical city" broadcasts. The "typical city" choice will be announced in about a month.

Qualifications Given  
The letter points out that the city had 93,392 population in November, 1957, and has grown by about 990 persons per month since.

Look Magazine cited Torrance as an "All-America City" in 1956 for solving its growth problems, and the National Municipal League did the same.

Virtually every race, color, and creed is represented in Torrance and there are no race problems.

Torrance was the first city planned for an industrial-residential balance.

It has 164 civic groups working for civic betterment.

It has new city hall, police station, and fire stations.

It has more churches per capita than any other city in California.

The median age in Torrance is 25.6 years, with half of the population under 21.

Population Grows  
The population has increased from 13,160 to 100,000 in 10 years and school population from 2000 to 23,000.

Municipal taxes have dropped 20 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation during the same period.

Torrance has the lowest crime rate of any California city in its population bracket and fire losses have been small.

There are no appreciable slums or blighted areas and there is a comprehensive master plan of development for maintenance of the industrial-residential-commercial balance.




