In the Cee competition, Bob Werhan tossed the shot putt 46' 4 1/2" for a first place; Fitzpatrick took the pole vault with 9' 8".

Ted Ross garnered second in the 100-yard dash and second in the 180-yard dash with a time of 19.2. Bill Hargrove took third in both events.

Qualifying for the CIF finals were Dick Spurgeon, Roger Smith, Jim Perry, Ted Ross, Bill Hargrove, Fitzpatrick, Werhan, and the 440-yard relay team.

The Cees' triumph over Aviation—the only new school besides South High in the Crescent League—was a major victory for the locals, according to Coach Scully who had high praise for the Spartans' efforts Friday.

A pair of 3 run innings by Crescent League champion Dominguez was enough to down the South High baseballers 9-5 Thursday in a non-league tilt on the El Camino diamond.

The powerful Dons ganged up on Spartan hurler John Mewborn in the third inning for three runs, with the big blow coming off the bat of Larry Voorhees, who smashed a home run. The Don slugger went 3 for 4 at the plate for the afternoon, wrecking the Spartans with the four-ply poke, and added a double and triple, for four RBIs.

The victors added one in the fourth and three in the fifth before South crossed the plate four times in the home half of the fifth to narrow the lead.

The scoring spree came on a 3-run scoring single by Mike Challis, who later tallied on an error.

The final Spartan run came in the sixth frame when Joe Austin tripled off the fence to push across Jim Hawkins all the way from first base.

The final Crescent League record for Coach Jerry McIlvaine's horsehiders was 4-4. Dominguez topped the standing with a 6-1 record.

# Hansen Breaks Record At 44th Annual League Track and Field Contest

Dennis Hansen ripped off a speedy 3:17.3 1320 time at the Bay League finals to crack the Torrance High Bee record and establish a new Bay League mark as the fleet-footed junior distance-man was the only record-breaker at the 44th Annual Bay League Track and Field Meet, Friday night at Redondo.

Both Louis Zamperini's 25-year-old THS record of 3:17.9, and the 1956 league record of 3:18.2 set by Hansen's teammate Len Ehlers fell by the wayside Friday when the blonde spiker breezed across the tape 40 yards ahead of runner-up John Bailey from Redondo.

Hansen will represent Torrance High and the Bay League Saturday when the CIF finals will be run at Carpinteria.

Seven other Tartar tracksters qualified for CIF berths with first, second, and third place showings at the league finals.

**High Jumpers**  
Bee high jumpers Gary Huffman and Jim Hester took first and third medals, respectively, as Huffman went over the bar at 5-8 to top the field.

Bob Weister's 18-9 broad jump was good enough to win him first place in the class "C" division, and varsity men Butch White, Ehlers, and Jim McDougall also qualified for the CIF meet.

White will enter two events at Carpinteria, as he took thirds in both the 100-yard dash and the 180 yard hurdles.

Ehlers, whose former "B" 1320 mark was shattered by Hansen, will vie for 880 honors after taking second at the league meet. Ehlers was barely nosed out at the finish line by a great finish by Bob Arnold of Inglewood, who cut the tape in 2:01.

### McDougall Places

Jim McDougall failed to qualify in his specialty, the pole vault, taking fifth, but cleared 21' in the broad jump, good enough for second place, and also will travel with Tartar track coach Howard Brubaker to the CIF meet Saturday.

Besides Hansen's record-breaking trek around the oval, the only other new mark set this year was by John Roth, of Santa Monica, who tossed the shot 55' 3/4" for a new C record a week previous during the prelims.

With scoring done on the 5-4-3-2-1 basis, Mira Costa took first place in Bay League with 60 points, well ahead of Santa Monica's 51 1/2. Torrance was fourth with 17 points; Inglewood third with 35; Leuzinger with 9, and Redondo with 7 1/2, completed the team scoring.
