Knight Silent on Aid to Knowland

Some 500 enthusiastic supporters of Governor Goodwin J. Knight met in Gardena Tuesday night at a giant dinner-rally for the U. S. Senatorial candidate.

The governor, who threw out his prepared speech, spoke off-the-cuff to the delight of capacity house at the Western Club.

He traded quips with Master of Ceremonies Johnny Grant, radio disc jockey, to keep the huge dining room in a state of campaign gaiety.

In a more serious vein, Knight held a press conference earlier at the home of Gardena Mayor Adams Bolton where he told some 25 South Bay area publishers and reporters of his platform on which he hopes to ride to Washington, D.C., this November.

The governor spoke of his policy of being honest with labor, citing his Labor Bill of Rights which has been in effect for some six months.

Declaring there had been no racial discrimination in his political appointments he reviewed his appointments of a Negro, Japanese, and Mexican as judges.

As to whether he will support Senator William Knowland in the latter's bid for the governorship, Knight said the two had never discussed the matter.

Accompanying the governor was one of his top political assets—Mrs. Virginia Knight, his wife.
