

Cubs Prepare Exhibit for Scout-O-Rama Next May 24

Scout-O-Rama, the gigantic Coliseum show on May 24, will feature Cub Pack 218-C and hundreds of other Scout units in demonstrations of science and industry on the theme "Preparing for Tomorrow's World."

Each unit will have the personal assistance of an industry "big brother" to act as Cooperating Partner in preparing the booth exhibits and demonstrations. The Dow Chemical Co. of Torrance will be Cooperating Partner for Unit 218-C and will provide the boys with technical "know-how" in demonstrating their home-made vacuum molding machine.

Using plastic polystyrene sheet, the boys heat the material with sun lamps and then draw the air away from underneath by means of a household vacuum cleaner. The material "sets up" on the dies which are also made by the pack members.

Cub Pack 218-C is sponsored by the Lomita Elementary School PTA with Arthur Holstien as cub master. J. H. Heflinger of the Dow Chemical Co. works with the group on the technical matters of the demonstration.

Ticket sales for this annual affair have jumped to 1000 in
