**Three Hollywood Rivierans To Get Eagle Scout Awards**

Hollywood Riviera's most illustrious Boy Scout Court of Honor is scheduled to be held Tuesday evening, at Riviera School, when three Riviera boys receive simultaneously Scoutdom's highest award, the eagle Scout award.

Rocky Manning, 13, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Manning, 429 Calley Mayor. During his two years of scouting, young Manning has been a senior patrol leader, scribe, and is presently quartermaster and patrol leader. He is a holder of the Silver Moccasin award, given upon completion of a 63-mile hike, and is a student of Newton School.

Patrol leader David Schwartz, 13, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Schwartz, 412 Via la Selva. He was formerly a patrol leader, has been in scouting 2 1/2 years and also holds the Silver Moccasin award. He is a student of South High School.

Jim Eckhart, 13, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. James Eckhart, 708 Calle de Arboles. He is senior patrol leader and was troop 718's Scout of the year for 1957. Young Eckhart is presently the troop's nominee for 1958 junior leader training, and has held the post of scribe during his years of scouting. He is also a holder of the silver Moccasin award, and a student at Riviera School.

The Court of Honor will open with an invocation by Rabbi Henri Front, a former Eagle Scout. Guests including Bob Waegner, South Bay District Commissioner, and Al Koester, president of the sponsoring Riviera Sportsmen's Club, will be introduced by Scoutmaster Eckhart. Eckhart will then direct the presentation of awards, assisted by assistant Scoutmasters Forrest Sedgewick, Paul Tibbitt and Granville Smith.

Other awards Among the other awards presented will be the tenderfoot awards to Frank Hudson, Cole Meek and Walter Wald. Second class awards will go to John Reynolds, Alan Rich, Skip Sedgewick, Greg Spaulding, Chris Watts and Jack Webb. Skip Roberts will receive the first class award, while Richard Mallory is awarded Star Scout. Lee Larsen will be awarded Life Scout. John Reynolds will receive

a one-year service pin. Two-year pins will go to Terry Christianson, Dan Ely and Donald Hoppe. Bill Satterlee will receive a 3-year pin while Robbie Hole gets his 4-year service pin.

Merit badges will be awarded to Lee Larsen, five merit badges; Bill McKnight, three merit badges; Doug Brown, five merit badges; Richard Mallory, three merit badges; Mike Behrendt, four merit badges; Pat McBurney, two merit badges, and Doug Hall and Jim Eckart, one merit badge each.

Perfect Attendance One year perfect attendance medals will be presented to Dan Ely, Dick Ferrell, Bill Jordan, Rocky Manning and Bill Satterlee.

Eagle rings will be presented to Scouts Manning, Eckhart and Schwartz, while their mothers will be presented with Eagle Scout pendants.

Scoutmaster Eckhart pointed to the long list of camping and hiking activities over the past year as the reason for the tremendous awards to be given Tuesday. Troop 718 has participated in 15 overnight camps, a 63-mile Silver Moccasin hike and a long term camp at Lake Arrowhead's Camp Pepperdine since January 1957. Two other Riviera boys, Bert Putsey and Bill Satterlee had achieved Eagle Scout earlier in the year and have been given their awards.

**Mounted Police Seek Fourth Parade Win**

The Torrance Mounted Police will be seeking its fourth first-place trophy of the year on May 31 when the mounted group parades in Santa Maria.

Latest victory for the popular Torrance mounted posse came last Friday when they swept the first prize trophy judging in the Gardena Loyalty Day Parade. They had previously won first in Westminster and San Bernardino, according to Police Lt. D. C. Cook, member of the unit.

The unit has been organized for several years as an auxiliary to the Torrance Police Department, and includes a number of prominent Torrance residents among its members.

**Phone Rates To Increase In California**

The California Public Utilities Commission today authorized The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co. to increase rates to produce approximately 4.8 per cent greater revenue on California operations.

The commission decision said the increase in gross revenues will be \$15,484,000 per year in addition to \$12,016,000 interim increase to subscribers in the Los Angeles extended service area authorized in December 1957, and now in effect. Total increase, including the \$12,016,000 will be \$27,500,000 per year instead of the \$40,799,000 applied for by PT&T, a reduction of 32 per cent.

Officials denied any increase in basic residential exchange charges in the Los Angeles extended service area and in the San Francisco-East Bay extended area.

**North High Students Given National Merit Tests Here**

A total of 128 students at North High School took the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test, Dale Harter, principal, announced today.

An estimated \$5 million in merit scholarships and other awards are at stake in the national competition, now beginning its fourth year. Some \$12 million in merit scholarships have been awarded in the first three years of the program. Merit scholarships are provided by 80 corporations, foundations, professional societies and individuals, as well as by the National Merit Scholarship Corp. itself, which conducts the competition.

The National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test is a three hour measure of educational growth and aptitude. Emphasis is on broad intellectual skills, and on understanding and ability to use what has been learned, rather than on sheer knowledge of facts.
