

# Physics Major To Receive College Award

Donald Paul McCollom, El Camino College physics major, will receive the award made to the outstanding student in general chemistry at the annual awards banquet to be held in the college Campus Center at 6:30 p.m. June 6. McCollom is a graduate of El Segundo High School. He will receive a "Handbook of Chemistry and Physics," the gift of the Chemical Rubber Co. In the Chemistry Achievement Award Test for 1958, which will be sponsored by the Chemical Rubber Co., El Camino will be represented by McCollom, who will be competing against students from colleges in the seven western states.
