PROTEIN FOODS

There's ample variety at meat counters. Remember to check your purchases not only for the number of servings you'll need—but consider the amount of lean you get per pound of meat. It's the lean that carries, for the most part, the proteins, vitamins and minerals.

High quality FRYERS will be widely featured again this week—popular prices. Plenty of TURKEYS, too. One market man suggests, for those who do not want a whole turkey, buying a quarter or half turkey. New, young toms are in now and plentiful.

BEEF loin steaks are a good buy now.

FORK is on its way down; it's a welcome change for pork lovers.

LAMB remains about the same price-wise.

EGGS remain plentiful and a comparatively good buy for the protein-conscious homemaker.

BARTLETT PEARS

Unlike many fruit pears are picked when mature—but hard. They ripen under controlled conditions. Store ripe pears in the refrigerator. Hold "green" pears at room temperature for two or three days or until ripe. Use ripe pears promptly. If kept too long they lose much of their delicate flavor.

A neat way to cut out the seed core from pear halves is to use a 1/2 teaspoon size measuring spoon or a melon ball cutter.

Fresh pears and gingerbread

go well together. Cut warm gingerbread in squares and top each serving with pear slices. Garnish with whipped cream mixed with a little honey—for those who permit the extras!
