Adventists Pastor to Join Others in Convention Work

Pastor Glenn L. Goffar of the Torrance Seventh-day Adventist Church will relieve the example of early American clergymen beginning Sunday, June 21.

On that date he will join some 250 ministers, Bible instructors, and other church workers to begin preparations for the Adventists' 56th annual Camp Meeting being held at 4100 Imperial Hwy., Lynwood, beginning June 25.

"THE EARLY American clergyman was by necessity as much a craftsman as he was a preacher," explained Pastor Goffar, "and it will be interesting to experience the type of life he lived if only for a few days."

Pastor Goffar will join his fellow ministers in equipping some 600 family-sized tents at the 40-acre convocation site. Other work includes the stringing of miles of electrical wiring, placing thousands of chairs, preparation of directional signs and a host of other chores.

Unitarians To Hear Professor

Dr. Robert Tapp, professor of theology at St. Lawrence U., Ogdensburg N. Y., will be guest speaker at services to be conducted at 11 a.m. Sunday at Pacific Unitarian Church. His topic will be "Liberalism's Continental Cousins."

A graduate of the University of Southern Calif., Dr. Tapp is chairman of the Commission on Social Concern of the Universalist Church of America. He has traveled with the American Friends Service Committee and worked at the Albert Schweitzer College in Churwalden, Switzerland.

Pastor Goffar will remain at the Lynwood site throughout the convocation, he said.
