

De Otis Marlett to Manage Palos Verdes Properties

Great Lakes Carbon Corp. announced this week that De Otis L. Marlett has assumed the duties and responsibilities of Ivar C. Hanson in the management of property interests on the Palos Verdes Peninsula, pending selection of a permanent successor. Marlett is vice president of Great Lakes Carbon Corporation and general manager of its Mining and Mineral Products Div. headquartered in Los Angeles.

MARLETT has been actively associated with the Palos Ver-

des development since the properties were acquired in 1953. A director of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, he is also active in many civic affairs.

Garden Checklist

By California Association of Nurserymen

1. Don't let fuchsias set seed pods. Pick the faded blooms off before they get that far if you want continued bloom.
2. Keep hanging baskets watered daily to offset the fast-drying effect of wind and air.
3. Water is the great need of other garden plants, also. Keep it on the leaves of such shallow rooted plants as fuchsias, camellias and azaleas, as well as at the roots.
4. For quickest color in bare spots, set out a plant or two of Marguerite. Check the new pinks as well as white and yellow varieties.
5. Take long stems when cutting roses to keep the plants compact and in good condition for new growth and bloom.

New Courses Approved By Board of Education

Two new language courses and a class in health and driver education for Torrance high school students were approved Tuesday night by the Board of Education.

The new courses are Russian I, which will be offered in South High School this fall; exploratory foreign language, which will be offered in summer school only; and health and driver education, which combines subjects formerly offered as parts of other courses.

The Russian course was approved, following a report on the success of an after-school Russian Club at South High last semester. Youngsters met weekly to learn the language and the program seemed to work well, school officials said. Torrance schools now offer Spanish, French, German and Latin in high schools.

BEGINNING Russian will be similar in content to the other language courses. If student interest continues, more advanced Russian classes will be offered, Assistant Superintendent Albert Posner said. The second new class, exploratory foreign language, will be given in summer school only. It will give eighth grade students a chance to sample French, Spanish, German and

Latin before enrolling in beginning sections of these languages in the fall.

It is designed to help students decide what language to take and to give them a broad view of several languages and countries.

THE HEALTH and driver education class, which will be a sophomore course, will include a number of subjects which state law requires be taught. These include driver training, first aid and accident prevention, public health and safety education, studies of the effects of tobacco, alcohol and narcotics, and conservation and fire prevention.

These subjects formerly were included in social studies and physical education classes. However, officials felt all subjects could be better taught if a new class were formed. In other action, the board also authorized a few changes in homemaking and freshman social studies courses.


