BEST BUYS FOR THE WEEK

In Torrance Markets

Since this is time to plan July 4th picnics perhaps you'd like a thought for another year... a no-drop hot dog. From Oklahoma comes news that a new bun mold has been designed and patented. The apparatus will bake a leak-proof bun, with one end open, ready to hold a weiner and its seasoning. The hot dog can be eaten like an ice cream cone.

BEEF supplies are running about 5% above last year. It is hoped that as the season progresses beef prices will become more attractive. Much of the beef will be of high quality that makes for juicy, tender steaks and roasts.

During barbecue season you will find roasts usually a better buy than steaks. Boned-and-rolled roasts are perfect for the rotisserie: rolled beef rump or beef rib eye roast, rolled lamb shoulder, and rolled,

boneless smoked ham, for example.

There will be more pork than usual for this time of the year... about 10% more than last July. No shortage of barbecued spareribs.

Chickens and turkeys for barbecues and rotisseries. Poultry continues as the economical item at the meat sections of markets. Whole chickens and turkeys or your favorite parts are ideal for most any occasion.

EGGS... for the picnic. Plentiful, reasonable. The easiest way to prepare and keep eggs for outing menus is in the shell. In an unbroken shell hard-cooked eggs keep for hours without refrigerator... thanks to the protection of the shell and the papery lining underneath.

"Hard-cooked" versus "hard-

boiled" eggs. Even though it takes a little longer to simmer than to boil eggs, most people prefer the tender, firm white of the hard-cooked eggs to the tougher "hard-boiled" texture.

PICNIC EGGS. In a large pan cover eggs completely with cold water. Bring water to a simmering temperature... and just below boiling... and simmer 20 to 25 minutes, depending on the size of egg. Remove from heat, put eggs at once in cold water, preferably running water. The chill halts the cooking and helps prevent dark color from forming on outside of yolk.
