

Coleman Gets \$600,000 in Contracts

Coleman Engineering Company, Inc., Torrance, has received two initial design and production contracts totalling about \$600,000 for missile ground handling equipment, signifying its entry into large scale manufacturing. T. C. Coleman, president, announced today.

The orders bring Coleman's backlog to approximately \$4,200,000, double the \$2,100,000 at this time a year ago.

One contract is for lift and transportation trailers and workstands for North American Aviation's Hound Dog air-to-surface missile, and the other for a missile nose cone transportation trailer for Avco Corp., Coleman said.

Garden Checklist

By California Association of Nurserymen

1. Lift gladiolus when the tops turn brown. Cut off the old stalks and burn them to curb any possible spreading of thrips. Store the corms in a cool, dry place.
2. Keep at roses with a light feeding, plenty of water and spraying as necessary. Where both pest and plague is on the bush, mix insecticide with fungicide when spraying.
3. Don't feed plants or lawns just before departing on your vacation. There's no need to bring on new and tender growth that might suffer from neglect.
4. You can sow perennials such as Delphinium, Primrose and Columbine in flats for bloom next year.
5. All shrubs and vines can be planted from nursery containers now. Don't overlook those in bloom, such as Roses, Fuchsias, Marguerites and others.
