ECC Swimming Registration Next Saturday

Registration for the final two summer periods of swimming instruction at El Camino College will be conducted Saturday morning, Dr. Stuart E. Maree, president of the college announced today.

In the first six weeks of the program, nearly 1000 swimmers used the pools each day for swimming instruction. Additional residents of the community took advantage of the college swim facilities daily for recreational swimming.

Minimum age for instruction is 7; swimmers must be at least 50 inches in height. Instructional periods from August 3 to 14 and August 17 to 28 will be established as follows:

- 8 a.m. - 9 a.m. — 10, 11 and 12-year-olds
- 9 a.m. - 10 a.m. — 7, 8 and 9-year-olds
- 10 a.m. - 11 a.m. — 10, 11 and 12-year-olds
- 11 a.m. - 12 n. — 7, 8 and 9-year-olds
- 1 p.m. - 2 p.m. — ages 13-17 inclusive
- 2 p.m. - 3 p.m. — 7, 8 and 9-year-olds
- 3 p.m. - 4 p.m. — 7, 8 and 9-year-olds
- 4 p.m. - 5 p.m. — 10, 11 and 12-year-olds
- 7 p.m. - 8 p.m. — Adults, 18 years and over
- 8 p.m. - 9 p.m. — Adults, 18 years and over

This instruction program extends from Monday through Friday. Tickets insuring instruction may be obtained at the Saturday registration in the Campus Center, starting at 8 a.m. Any tickets not sold on registration day may be purchased next week in the college business office. Children may purchase tickets themselves, but children must accompany adults who wish to purchase tickets for the child.

The pools will be open for recreational swimming on Monday through Friday from 6 to 7 p.m., when a Family Hour is conducted for adults 18 years and over and children under 18 who are accompanied by their parents. From 9 to 10 p.m., the pools are open for

recreational swimming to adults over the age of 18.

Swimmers are required to furnish their own suits and towels, and women and girls must bring bathing caps. No registration is required for recreational swimming, although a charge of 10 cents is made for children and 25 cents for adults using the pools.

A charge of \$1 is made for the two-week instructional period; the same charge is made for adults and children.

Additional to the swimming program, the college offers outdoor and gym recreational facilities through the day and an evening program of recreation for adults each evening, Monday through Friday. No charge is made for the use of these facilities, and no registration is
