

Adam Sujadi Finds New Life Magic

Foreign Exchange are magic words in any language and to the students who receive the opportunity to visit the United States it is the opening of the doors to a new world with many wonderful and remarkable experiences ahead.

The case of Adam Sujadi is no exception. The 18-year-old high school senior arrived this week from Bantul, Indonesia, on the island of Jogjakarta. One of the American Field Service exchange students, Adam will be the guest of Mr. and Mrs. Robert E. Brigham, 18713 Doty, and will attend North high school this fall.

Dressed in Levis, sport shirt and canvas shoes, clothes he has seen only in Western movies, the Indonesian youth's eyes here as he recounted to the HERALD his first flight in an airliner across the ocean and then after a short rest in Milwaukee, his trip by jet to International Air Port.

OF THE 90 foreign exchange students who arrived at the Wisconsin disbursement point, Adam Sujadi was one of seven scheduled for the Los Angeles area.

"I got dizzy," Adam said when asked about his long trip by air. "But then things are so different in America I also feel dizzy at times here on the ground."

The Java lad is amazed by our appliances in the home, the hugeness of our super markets and their automatic doors and the fact that every one here owns an automobile. "IN INDONESIA only a rich man has a car. Most of us ride on bicycles, although my father has a motorcycle," he pointed out.

Adam is a boy scout and the name of his troop is Hizbulwathon, which means "hero" in Arabic. He is a champion chess player and is anxious to engage his new "father" in a game. When spelling out the name of his troop "H-Z" on the third letter, "It is see! Then he drew the letter 'Z' in the air with his finger.

Besides chess, Adam lists his hobbies as reading, stamp collecting, soccer and badminton. He admits our food is quite different from menus he is used to, but said he likes every thing he has eaten so far and wants to try them all.

Adam met "Ninik" at the airport in Manila. She was enroute home after being a foreign exchange student at Westchester high school during the past school year.

When asked what he plans to be when he finishes school, Adam said, "I want to be a doctor and help people." His father is a school teacher and either teachers, or studying to his brother and sisters are become teachers.

"I like my new family," Adam said as he indicated Mrs. Brigham and her children, Ron, Barbara, David and Robie.

Clatawa Provides New Experiences
