Expectant Parents' Fall Classes Begin Sept 10

The fall series of expectant parents' classes will start Thursday, Sept. 10, at 1 p.m., in the Torrance Health Center, 2300 Carson St., according to Dr. B. A. Kogan, District Health Officer.

The classes are an educational service of the County Health Department and are planned to help parents meet the demands of parenthood. There are no registration or other fees for these classes.

Miss Aurora Martinez, Public Health Nurse, who has previously conducted the classes, will again be the instructor. Topics of discussion which are scheduled include: how the baby grows before birth, labor and delivery, care of the newborn, care of the mother after delivery, formula preparation, infant feeding, baby bath and care of the older child.

The film "Human Reproduction" has been planned for the September 10 meeting and several other films on the care of the new mother and baby are scheduled for future sessions.

Prospective mothers and fathers are welcomed to join these classes.
