Boat Owners Reminded of New Safety Registration Statutes

Owners of the quarter million or more motorboats now being operated in California's far-flung recreational waters are affected by the new small boat safety and registration law enacted at our 1959 session. Worked out during months of intensive study and days of hearings by the Assembly Committee on Public Utilities and Corporations and the Senate Committee on Natural Resources, the new act is expected to promote greater safety as well as greater uniformity in regulations covering small boat operations.

The new safety provisions which are spelled out in the law, and the penalties for their violation, are already in effect. The state small craft harbors

commission is given authority to adopt additional safety regulations after public hearing as required by statute. The provisions which require registration and numbering of boats go into effect April 1, 1960.

FOR PURPOSES of the act the word "vessel" is defined to include every kind of craft, except a seaplane, which can be used for water transportation. "Motorboats" are divided into four classes according to length, and the lights which must be carried by each class when underway between sunset and sunrise are specified for each class. All craft over sixteen feet are required to carry a whistle or other me-

chanical sound producer. All over twenty six feet must also carry a bell.

Every vessel not documented by the U.S. Bureau of Customs must carry at least one life preserver, or other device prescribed by regulations of the state small craft commission, and every vessel carrying passengers for hire must carry one for each person. Fire extinguishers, as required by commission regulations, must be carried and kept in working condition. Flame arresters for inboard engines using gasoline fuel, and ventilating devices to remove explosive gases from bilges or fuel tanks must be carried when regulations demand. The commission is also permitted to modify its rules to keep them in conformity with federal law or Coast Guard regulations.

THE LAW permits any local agency to adopt ordinances or rules relating to the operation or equipment of boats using waters within its territory, provided they do not conflict with the new law or regulations under it. The commission is also granted power to adopt special rules at the request of a local agency with only limited effect, and special rules covering waters in two or more jurisdictions where existing regulations conflict.

The law contains strong provisions controlling water skiing, both for the boat opera-

tor and skier. Operations of a boat by anyone while under influence of liquor or narcotics, or use of water skis when in such condition, is prohibited.

REPORTS OF WATER accidents involving injury or death, or considerable property damage, must be made to the department of natural resources. The owner of a vessel is made legally responsible for injury or damage due to the negligent operation of his craft, up to a maximum of \$20,000 for injury or death, \$10,000 for property damage. Penalties ranging from a \$10 fine or 5 days, up to \$500 or 6 months in a county jail, are provided for violation of law or rules.

Starting next April 1, every undocumented vessel, unless otherwise exempt, must be registered with the department of motor vehicles, and a \$5 fee paid for assignment of a number which must be lettered on the bow of the boat. The fee covers three years and may be renewed for \$3.
