Know-how in marketing can help any housewife stretch her dollar, save her time, and serve up meals that are varied, appetizing and healthful.

TAKE THE humble onion, for instance. Look for a clean, hard bulk, a thin neck, and a skin that's dry enough to crackle. That's the onion that's in first class shape—it'll be worth what you pay for it.

On take melons—so important to summer menu planning and so disappointing if you get a bad one. You can tell when a Casaba or a Cranshaw melon is ripe when the rind is somewhat yellowed and the blossom end is a little soft.

Vets Advised Of Outpatient Medical Care

Veterans of either wartime or peacetime service were reminded today by Veterans Service Officer Bessie D. Sloecker, whose office is located at 1622 Gramercy Ave., of the eligibility rules for "outpatient" care through the Federal Veterans Administration.

If he has wartime service, the veteran must have been discharged or retired under conditions "other than dishonorable," and be in need of treatment for a disability incurred or aggravated in wartime service.

AN EXCEPTION to this rule applies for Spanish-American War veterans, including the Philippines Insurrection and the Boxer Rebellion, whose disabilities are considered service-connected for the purposes of outpatient care; not, however, for local hospitalization.

In the case of peacetime service only, the veteran to be eligible for outpatient treatment must have been discharged for disability, or be receiving compensation, or be eligible to receive compensation except for the receipt of retirement pay. And he must require treatment for a disability incurred or aggravated in service.

DISABLED veterans who are receiving training under either the World War II or the Korean Conflict vocational rehabilitation programs, and who need outpatient medical care for nonservice-connected disabilities to prevent interruption of their training, may be so entitled.

Assistance in applying for outpatient treatment by making out the proper forms is offered by the Veterans Service Office.
