Kelleher signed with the Hollywood Stars in 1944. After serving in the armed forces in 1945, he returned to the Stars and thrilled the fans until he retired after the 1954 season. He played on six pennant-winning teams in his 19-year baseball career, compiling a lifetime batting average of .285. He hit 359 home runs.

Anglers Eye Tuna Catch

SAN DIEGO—With catches at the Coronado Islands still rolling along at a record clip, anglers are preparing to shoot the works in their efforts to bag a heavy yellow or bluefin tuna before the close of the final qualifying round of the \$25,000 San Diego Yellowtail Derby Sept. 13.

With a scant week to go, minimum qualifying weight now stands at 21 pounds 14 ounces and yellowtail catches at the islands are ranging from 2000 to 2500 daily.

As of next Sunday night, the 150 top anglers of the third eight-week period will earn the right to engage in a one-day fishoff for a station wagon and other valuable prizes on Sept. 19. Winner of the top qualifying award this week was Paul Schakel, 1836 Arrowhead Ave., San Bernardino, with a 25-2 yellow. Runner-up was Iso Tabata, 13186 S. Harbor Blvd., Garden Grove, with an even 25 pounder.

Juvenile Bureau Officers Study Joyride Injury

The juvenile bureau of Torrance Police Dept. today was still investigating the case in which a 17-year-old Redondo Beach youth "borrowed" a flatbed truck from a housing tract east of Prospect Ave. in Torrance, and went for a joyride, only to have one of seven other juveniles fall off the vehicle and suffer a broken hip.

Seriously injured when the rear left wheel ran over him was Ramon Guerra, Jr., age 13, 621 N. Irena, Redondo Beach. The accident occurred last week in North Maria, Redondo. Young Guerra is still confined at Pacific View Hospital, Redondo.

The 17-year-old youth told juvenile authorities here he found the truck keys under the front seat.

Passenger on the motorcycle was Daniel Holly, 18415 Falda, who was unhurt, police said. Berduzco's wife and six children also escaped injuries.

Garden Checklist By California Association of Nurserymen

1. Set out plants of Stock, Snapdragon, Calendula, Iceland Poppy, Pansy and Viola for winter color.
 2. Fertilize lawns regularly to keep them green, healthy and disease resistant. Keep watering them deeply.
 3. Lawns can be started this month. The most frequent reason for trouble in this operation is failure to keep the seedbed moist; so be warned!
 4. Tuberous Begonias, Fuchsias and Potted Geraniums can take feeding in September. Check with your nurseryman for recommended food.
 5. Don't prune grapes just because the crop is gone. Wait until plants are more dormant—in November or December.
