Garden Checklist

By California Association of Nurserymen

1. Go light on rose feeding this month. Hold off entirely as October approaches. Too much food in September brings new growth at pruning time when you don't want it.
2. Spike compacted lawns to aid water penetration. You'll be surprised at how fast they green up afterward.
3. Disbud camellias that have set too many buds. Bigger blooms will result. The fewer buds, the bigger the bloom, so be your own judge.
4. Winter sweet peas should go in the ground without delay if you want their color for Christmas.
5. Hurry with winter bedding plants. They'll become spring bedding plants if you don't get them in soon.

Torrance Schools Have Lowest 'Per Pupil' Cost in L.A. County

Cost of educating Torrance's youngsters is still the biggest bargain in the county's educational system, figures compiled by County Superintendent of School revealed this week.

And this fact means a savings of about 79 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation to Torrance property owners, Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools, told the board of education when the figures were revealed.

Average "per pupil" cost in the county was \$400.75, the county report showed. Torrance's "per pupil" cost of \$343.22 means the local budget would have to be \$1,425,000 larger and the tax rate 79 cents higher to bring the city's costs up to the county average, Dr. Hull said.

"Torrance emphasizes spending money where it affects children directly," he said. Among the many factors keeping Torrance costs down is the relative youth of the district, which means newer buildings, less maintenance cost, more efficient procedures, being established at the Torrance teachers on entering salary levels, and the unified district which does not require duplicating administrative organizations for elementary and high schools.
