Sanitation and safety factors are considered to the smallest detail to provide the very best patient care possible, he said.

Concluding with high praise for the "dedicated sisters" of the Little Company of Mary nursing order, Dr. Wilson said the "administration of the hospital is in the finest hands it could be. The doctors will enjoy the hospital as the patients will appreciate it."
