Harbor City-Lomita Church Joins Visitation Crusade

Approximately 100 members of the Harbor City-Lomita Methodist Church will participate in a Visitation Crusade Oct. 16-19. "Sharing God's Good News" is the theme of the emphasis which is being conducted simultaneously in more than 400 churches of the Southern California-Arizona Conference of the Methodist Church.

The area-wide emphasis has been planned in conjunction with the denomination's National Council of Evangelism's annual meeting. More than 500 ministers and laymen from across the United States were to participate in the Council's meeting at the First Methodist Church of Hollywood yesterday. Outstanding Bishops and Theologians are to address the meeting, through Friday noon when the delegates will be assigned to local churches to assist in the Crusade.

THE REV. Robert E. Young of the Richland Hills Methodist Church of Fort Worth, Texas, will be assigned to the Lomita Church to assist the pastor, The Rev. Clarence E. Spier Jr. He will preach in the church's two worship services on Sunday, Oct. 18th, and instruct the members of the church in the principles of visitation before each period of visitation.

Members of the Harbor City-Lomita Methodist Church will also participate in a Prayer

Vigil lasting from noon Sunday until midnight. During the vigil the members of the church will be continuously in prayer for the twelve-hour period—as will members of more than 50 churches of the Long Beach District of the church.

THE CRUSADE will close on Tuesday evening at the First Methodist Church of Los Angeles. For the closing service Bishop Gerald Kennedy will address an audience estimated to include more than 7000 Methodists congregated in Santa Maria, San Diego, Tucson, and Phoenix as well as the Los Angeles church. A special telephone hook-up will link the five cities for the reports of the visitation and the Bishop's address.

"WE ANTICIPATE that this Crusade will enable us to reach into many homes of this community where we have never gone before and acquaint them with the opportunities for Worship and Service which our Church provides," states the Rev. Mr. Spier. "Our youth and adults are looking forward to the Crusade with enthusiasm and a sense of expectancy."


