Garden Checklist
By California Association of Nurserymen

1. Mulch around shrubs and perennials with steer manure. Winter rains will work on it to improve soil and provide a mild, long lasting source of food.
2. Check nurseries for Azaleas in bloom. They will give you color in most areas well into spring.
3. You can begin pruning grapes now. No hurry since you have some three months to do it at your leisure.
4. It's too early to prune roses in California. Wait until after Christmas. January is even better.
5. More Camellias are coming into bloom all the time. Periodic checks with your nurseryman may turn up varieties you've never seen in bloom before.








