**Annual Marine Boat Show Set For Jan. 3-17**

Southern California Marine Association's Fourth Annual Boat Show has been scheduled for Jan. 8 thru 17th in Los Angeles' Great Western Exhibit Center.

Show producer H. Werner Buck declared that the 1960 marine gigante would contain 20 per cent more exhibit space than the 1959 record breaker, adding:

"We are now not only the first major boat show of 1960 but also the largest marine show in the West." George Bristol, chairman of the Show Committee's space sales, said that additional space now will provide more than 200,000 square feet of under cover exhibit display room.

The nation's top manufacturers of boats, motors and marine accessories will show for the first time their complete lines of merchandise.

Marine products from several foreign countries, Europe and the Far East will be shown.

**DEATH TAKES EL CAMINO BASKETBALLER**

Richard Nishimoto, first-string guard on El Camino's basketball team, died Saturday at 2:30 p.m. in Gardena Hospital from a combination pneumonia-blood poisoning.

Funeral services for the 18-year-old Nishimoto will be held Friday at 7:30 p.m. in the Gardena Buddhist Church.

Burial will be Saturday at 10 a.m. at Green Hills Cemetery, 27501 S. Western, San Pedro.

Nishimoto, a summer 1958 graduate of Gardena High "had as much potential as anyone I've ever coached," said George Stanich, although Nishimoto never played varsity basketball at Gardena. He did play Bee ball.

The 5-8 Nishimoto played basketball only five days before his death.

Monday, Nov. 16, El Camino scrimmaged Pasadena Nazarene at El Camino, Nishimoto starting at his guard position.

Tuesday he complained of a sore back and practiced lightly. Wednesday found him in bed with an aching back and a 102-degree temperature.


Nishimoto's sickness developed into pneumonia, after which blood poisoning set in.

Saturday his condition worsened and he was placed in an oxygen tent. At 2:30 p.m., with Coach George Stanich and members of his immediate family at his side, he died.

Nishimoto, 1498 W. 154th St., Gardena, is survived by his father, Henry Nishimoto, his mother, Yukino, his sister Alice, and his two brothers, Bob and Jackie.
