Millions of pounds of fresh and processed cranberries have been "cleared" by the Food and Drug Administration. You may safely serve this healthful fruit in its traditional place in the Thanksgiving dinner ... and as often as you wish for the rest of the season.

The United States Department of Agriculture confidently anticipates that food suppliers will pass on this assurance to their customers.

PROTEIN FOODS

About now the idea of a fine menu is ... "anything for a change." You've had a festive holiday ... but what to do with some of the leftovers?

Chicken-Turkey. Serve cold in salads, sandwiches, or sliced with hot stuffing and gravy and hot vegetables. Don't re-heat by steaming or baking. If you do, it tastes just like it is, a leftover. Combine it with sauce in a casserole, if you must have it hot.

Duck ... usually small and so delicious that leftovers are no problem.

Goose. Make a ragout. To 4 cups of cooked goose, add 2 tablespoons each of lemon juice and Worcestershire sauce, and 2 cups goose gravy. Simmer about 20 minutes. Add 1/2 cup sliced ripe olives, 1/2 cup sherry wine. Serve at once on toast.

Eggs. We sometimes wonder how the farmers who supply

us with eggs can stay in business. Can you remember when eggs have continued at such bargain prices for so long? Supplies are still ample, and you'll be able to have all the pumpkin pies, egg nogs, and egg dishes you want, and keep within your budget.

Apples ... fine varieties, fine quality.

Grapefruit, Persimmons ... Combine avocado, grapefruit and persimmon in tasty salad. The combination provides a self-made salad dressing.

Winter Pears. Anjou, Bosc and Comice, like bananas, are ripened off the tree. Even when ripe they are not the golden yellow often associated with a ripe pear. The Anjou may be a pale green, the Bosc a russet brown, the Comice a yellow-green when they are fully ripe, fragrant and ready to eat.

Leaders Break Ground for Assembly of God Sanctuary

Groundbreaking ceremonies recently at the First Assembly of God Church at 3654 Torrance Blvd., signaled the beginning of a construction program which will see a new church sanctuary erected, it was reported this week by the Rev. William T. Holcomb, pastor of the church during most of its existence.

On hand to participate in the ceremonies were the Rev. T. C. Cunningham of Pasadena, assistant superintendent of the Southern California District Council of the Assemblies of God; David Figueredo, representing the city's planning commission; the Rev. Mr. Holcomb, and members of the church's board and congregation.

The new 38 x 80 structure will be used to house a congregation which began holding

services in a garage at the site a few years ago.

The garage was expanded as the congregation grew, and in 1956 the first permanent church building was erected, an educational building which has served as a place of worship until now. The building was erected debt free, the Rev. Holcomb reports.

New Aeronca Building Set For Torrance

Construction of an addition valued at \$325,000 has been scheduled at the Aeronca Manufacturing Corp. plant here, it was announced this week by company officials.

John Lawler, president of the firm which purchased Longren Aircraft facilities here earlier this year, disclosed plans for the new construction during a recent groundbreaking ceremony. The building will be at 24751 Crenshaw Blvd. adjacent to present facilities.

Plans call for occupancy by Feb. 1, 1960. The building will provide an additional 60,000 square feet of office and construction space, officials said. Also included are plans for an air conditioning system and parking for 300 additional employees.
