

The large scale operation will be highlighted by simultaneous raids on Kalsin, Isthmus, and Fasagshak Bays at Kodiak.

Returning date for the Marines to Camp Pendleton is scheduled for Dec. 10.

McCorvey of 18914 Cranbrook Ave., serving aboard the radar picket destroyer USS Duncan, took part in a large fleet training exercise off the coast of Southern California, Nov. 2-6, involving units of the U. S. Pacific Fleet.

The exercise, under the direction of the Commander of the First Fleet, "pitted "Blue" attack carrier striking forces against opposing "Orange" defensive forces. The Blue forces launched carrier aircraft attacks and simulated guided missile attacks on a large land mass. The Orange defenders attempted to stop them with Navy carrier and land-based aircraft an surface craft.

Submarines practiced attacks on the groups uring the early phase of the exercise.

The 11-week course included instruction in all basic military subjects and infantry weapons.

Upon completion of training new Marines are assigned to a unit for further infantry training, or to one of the many Marine Corps schools.
