New Quota Opens Guard Ranks to 500 More Men, General Reports

Newly established quotas calling for some 500 young men are rapidly being filled in the 40th Armored Division, California National Guard, Major General Homer O. Eaton Jr., Commanding General, announced today.

Men without previous military service will take six months active duty training commencing within three months after enlistment. Active duty includes eight weeks of basic training and four months of specialized technical training at a United States Active Army post.

"These Guardsmen return to their home stations trim and fit, well trained soldiers, and with good futures in their own National Guard units," General Eaton declared.

Men who complete the six months active duty training may go on to earn commissions as second lieutenants completing courses at one of the available officer candidate schools. Opportunities also are available for appointment to the United States Military Academy at West Point.

General Eaton also pointed out that vacancies now exist for men with prior military experience who wish to complete their military obligation. Openings are available in some units for junior-grade officers up to and including the rank of captain.

Pastor of Western Avenue Baptist Church Honored

The Western Avenue Baptist Church surprised their pastor, Rev. Walter R. Graham, with a surprise 10th anniversary celebration last Sunday evening. Rev. Graham became pastor of the church in December, 1949 and has led the congregation in a vigorous program of advancement since that time.

The Rev. Wayne Kyllingstad, Minister of Education for the church served as the emcee for the festivities. The program followed somewhat the "This is Your Life" theme, as the events and highlights of the past ten years were reviewed.

The congregation presented Pastor Graham with a new movie camera and also presented gifts to Mrs. Graham, and their two sons, Bob and John.

Under Rev. Graham's leadership in the past 10 years, the church has grown from about 50 active people to nearly 600 members. The church relocated to its present location on Western Ave., and two large buildings were erected, a prayer chapel built, and a Christian Day School begun which now has 165 students and all elementary grades.

The current expense budget has been increased from \$51,000 the first year, to nearly \$40,000 for the present year. In addition is a \$30,000 budget for the school.

The evening concluded with various people giving testimonials as to how much Pastor Graham's ten year ministry has meant to their lives. A beautiful cake and a testimonial notebook were also presented to the Graham's.

Pageant to Tell Christmas Story At Church Rites

The Christmas Story will be told by living tableaux with narration and music in the gardens of Neighborhood Church in Palos Verdes Estates when the Nativity Pilgrimage is presented by the Peninsula church for the eighth year this evening at 6 and at 7:30.

A cast of 45, in colorful and authentic costumes, will present six scenes laid in settings of natural beauty located throughout the two and one half acres of gardens that lie along the ocean bluff below the Palos Verdes Plaza.
