Missionary to Central America To Speak Here

The Rev. Daniel F. Dyck, missionary to the Dominican Republic, will speak as a representative of the Missionary Church Assn. at the Lomita Missionary Church, 2043 Lomita Blvd., on Sunday at 7:30 p.m. and on Tuesday, Jan. 5, at 7:30.

Mr. Dyck and his collaborators pioneered a new mission field along the Dominican-Haitian frontier in 1945. Since then he has completed three terms of missionary service there.

During his second and third terms Mr. Dyck served his mission in the capacity of field chairman. Besides co-ordinating field activities, he has given much time to evangelism, and the supervision of building missionary residences, a school, and chapels. He also helped to institute a Bible

MR. DYCK IS a graduate of Fort Wayne Bible College. He held several pastorates in Ohio and Indiana before going to the mission field.

It is the firm conviction of Mr. Dyck that the Gospel must be preached today — tomorrow may be too late. He also holds that the future of Christian work in Dominican Republic depends on the training of consecrated national leaders.
