

Bible Study Program Told

The Narbonne Avenue Baptist Church of Lomita will conclude a week of Bible study Friday. An intensive study of I and II Timothy has been led by their pastor, Robert A. Wells. This is an annual affair in the Lomita church, conducted the first week in January.

New 'Blue Chip' Stamp Plan Introduced in Major Markets

A new trading stamp plan was introduced to residents of Southern California and Southern Nevada Monday.

Blue Chip stamps will be given to customers at major grocery and drug chains and at innumerable independent stores and service stations throughout nine counties in Southern California and Southern Nevada. Counties where the plan is being introduced include Los Angeles, Orange, San Bernardino, Riverside, Ventura, Kern, San-

ta Barbara, a portion of San Luis Obispo and Clark County, Nev.

AMONG THOSE introducing Blue Chip stamps are Safeway, Ralphs, Von's, Shopping Bag, Market Basket, Thriftmart, Alexander's, Lucky Stores, The Boys, Food Giant, Shopper's Cracker Barrel, Stater Bros., Market, Jordano Bros., Purity, and Thrifty, and Save-On Drug Better Foods, Beach Grocers,

Stores. According to Donld Koepfel, vice-president and general manager of the Blue Chip Stamp Co., with "the introduction of the stamps to Southern California, Blue Chip — operating only in California and Southern Nevada — becomes the second largest trading stamp plan in volume within the United States. We anticipate having 8000 outlets in California by

the end of 1960."

THIS IS HOW the plan works. Stamps are given to every customer on the basis of one stamp for each 10 cent purchase. Stamps and saver books are available at every cash counter of a Blue Chip store. Only 1200 stamps are needed to fill a book. And because of the many outlets from which stamps can be obtained, it will be possible for the customer to fill a saver book much faster than is possible with

other stamp plans. Saver books, when filled, are taken to a Blue Chip redemption store. Five redemption stores will open early in January at the following locations: 5464 Wilshire Blvd., Los Angeles; 5133 Lankershim Blvd., No. Hollywood; 6212 W. Manchester; 4307 Leimert Blvd., Los Angeles; and 2724 E. Anaheim St., Long Beach. From 40 to 50 redemption stores will be operating in Southern California by the end of 1960.

FULL COLOR catalogue showing 52 pages of premium items are available at all Blue Chip outlets. The Blue Chip Stamp Co. has leased a five-story building containing 216,295 square feet at 800 McGarry St., Los Angeles to serve as Blue Chip headquarters and premium merchandise warehouse for the Southern California-Nevada areas.
