Torrance Junior Woman's Club is planning an educational film presented by the American Cancer Society to accompany their January business meeting to be held Wednesday, Jan. 13, at 8 p.m. in the clubhouse, 1422 Engracia, Torrance.

Because of the need for widespread education concerning cancer, the Juniors are inviting anyone interested in viewing the film to attend. The motion picture will commence promptly at eight and will last no longer than one hour — guests then may be excused before the business meeting begins.

The title of the film is "Time and Two Women," starring Dr. Joe V. Meigs, consulting and visiting gynecologist at the Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, and two actresses portraying patients from the case history files of Dr. Meigs. The movie is the second educational cancer film presented by the American Cancer Society and is represented as "A direct

and moving presentation of cancer of the uterus, and cytology — emphasizing the curability of this disease."

It is the purpose of this film to acquaint all women with the need for a yearly gynecological check-up. Quoting Dr. Charles S. Cameron, vice-president of the American Cancer Society, "The problem of cervical cancer could be virtually eliminated if we could persuade all women to be examined by the cytological (cell staining) method each year — and if we had the professional manpower to interpret the slides."

gel, 4463 Silver Saddle Lane, Rolling Hills.


