Baldwin Promoted To Class A Club

Bill Baldwin, 19-year-old righthander from Torrance, is scheduled to report to the Philadelphia Phillies' spring training camp in Florida March 1 after a successful first season in organized baseball.

Baldwin, of 1432 W. 223rd St., Torrance, is a 1959 graduate of Narbonne High School.

He was recently promoted to the Phillies' Class A Eastern League farm team at Williamsport, Pa., after posting a 7-3 won-lost record at Johnson City, Tennessee (Class D) of the Appalachian League last summer.

Baldwin, a noted fast ball pitcher, first attracted the notices of baseball scouts when he played in the Torrance Central Babe Ruth League. He was also a two year varsity letterman at Narbonne.

He was signed by Scout Babe Herman in June, after graduation, and was assigned to the Johnson City club.

L. Richardson and L. Jeffries came up with a 1301 tally for third and \$148.38. W. Bates and K. Bates claimed fourth


with their 1296, as the Wells and Wells combination settled for fifth with their 1279.

R. BUTCHER and T. Cochran posted an impressive 1267 to take first place honors and loot of \$100 in the holiday event Ladies division, with D. Cato and A. Johnson scoring 1251 for second and P. Walls and L. Barnowsky third with their 1248.

Individual female honors were copped by K. Bates after her 670 set topped the ladies' singles, paying off \$62.76. Second place and \$52.03 was latched onto by K. Roddan, who totaled 666. L. Jeffries and her 655 took third and \$42.58 while C. Cucci claimed fourth with 662 and Z. Church fifth, posting a nifty 651.

T. LAZAR CONNECTED for a blistering 725 tally to capture the top position in the Men's singles to pocket \$83.27; the \$75.70 second place green stuff went to D. Redfoot for his sizzling 714. Third spot honors and \$56.77 were claimed by B. Chaplin for his 712 package while the 709 posted by S. Mendola took fourth and \$49.22. L. Wickesham followed with 708. J. McCall, 707, L. Antista, 706 and J. Cuervo with 695.
