Park Experts In Pasadena to Trade Findings

"Looking Back to See Ahead" was the theme this week when California Society, American Institute of Park Executives, held its 11th annual conference in Pasadena, according to Casper Clemmer, park superintendent for Torrance.

Attending the four-day session which concluded yesterday, Clemmer said he concentrated on sessions focusing attention on the field of public parks.

Subjects under discussion at the convention ranged from the interest of citizens in public parks to budget and management analysis.

Dr. Fred E. Case, associate professor of business administration and director, real estate research, UCLA, made the keynote address, speaking on the topic, "Your Stake in the Future."

TEAC Given Up-to-Date School Notes

Barring unforeseen developments, Torrance children will move into one new school, one rehabilitated school, and additions to 10 other schools within the next two months.

That was what James E. Crockett, director of new construction for Torrance schools, told the Torrance Educational Advisory Committee Monday noon, in a report on school building activities.

Adams School, 238th and Arlington, should be open about the middle of March, he said, relieving double sessions at Wood School. Rehabilitation earthquake-proofing of Fern School should be complete about the same time, he said, relieving the load at Greenwood School.

ADDITIONS AT Walteria, Steele, Madison, Edison, and Torrance Elementary Schools should open about the first of February, he noted, while additions to Anza, Lincoln, Newton, Arlington, and Sepulveda will open about the middle of the month.

Depending on progress of construction and the weather, Towers School, Ronald and Towers, may open late this spring, helping crowded conditions at Steele and Flavian Schools. Madison, which will relieve Carr and Perry, probably will be ready about the close of school.

Additions to North and South High will open early next year.

Now on the planning boards are Victor Elementary School, West High School, Hickory Ave. Elementary School, and additions to Torrance High.

UCLA Alumni Offer Study Scholarships

William E. Forbes, president of the UCLA Alumni Assn., has announced that applications are now being accepted for the 1960 UCLA Alumni Scholarship Awards.

Offered in conjunction with the University Scholarship program, the alumni awards range from \$150 to \$400, with possible recommendation for larger awards. Forbes pointed out that the minimum award of \$150 covers the full student and incidental fees for two semesters. As UCLA charges no tuition, an award of this size is equal in value to \$1000 or more at some California institutions.

High school seniors who have acquired an overall "B" average in academic subjects are eligible to apply.

Applications may be obtained from the scholarship counselor at each high school, or directly from the UCLA Scholarship Office. Deadline for submission of applications is March 1. Award winners will be announced the first week in May.

All eligible seniors are invited to apply, and Forbes urges interested students to inquire further from their high school scholarship counselor.




