

Don Wilson Unveils Modern New Offices

Formal dedication and grand opening ceremonies were held this week end by Don Wilson Builders at their new office and general administration building. The new structure, located at 2918 Compton Blvd., Gardena, houses all divisions of the corporation: Southwood Construction Co., escrow division, general accounting, and corporate offices.

Built by Southwood Construction Co., the 6000 square foot building cost in excess of \$80,000.

Planning and design were based on the requirements of the firm for adequate space to group all divisions under one roof, yet allow for continued expansion of each division.

COMPLETELY air-conditioned throughout, the new concrete and steel building features an exterior of natural stone, cast pebble concrete and glass areas forming wall units. Aluminum screen grilles and heavy cypress wood verticals are interspersed with the wall

units to offer contrast. Dramatic interior treatment is achieved by use of a 20-foot ceiling in the main reception office. Liberal use of cypress and walnut paneling lend color and contrast to rough acoustical plaster ceilings and marbleized tile floors.

IMMEDIATELY off the main reception lobby a suite of four offices houses the Escrow division. Southwood Construction is group in their own wing of the building. Their offices face

an attractively planted, open patio which offers maximum light yet is so designed to afford complete privacy. Accounting also has its own wing, located at the rear of the building away from noise and normal office traffic.

In the corporate wing, Don Wilson, president of the firm, has his office. Three walls are paneled in rich walnut. Floor to ceiling sliding glass doors, opening onto a private, planted patio, form the fourth wall. The luminous ceiling is composed

of alternating units of plastic and acoustical plaster. Wilson's custom designed executive desk is made of walnut to match the wall paneling.

IN ADDITION to the desk, one corner of the office contains a built-in twelve foot leather lounge with four matching chairs grouped around a low conference table for relaxed staff meetings. This furniture grouping looks out on the landscaped patio. Carpeting is alternating panels of deep blue, white and orange stripes two inches wide interspersed with black beams. Imported Philippine Capiz shell shutters allow sunlight to filter into the office.

Over 6000 square feet of paved, private parking adjoins the building for use of customers and employees.

DON WILSON Builders' current 465-unit home development, Southwood Estates, located one mile west of Hawthorne Blvd. on Torrance Blvd., is now 92 per cent sold out. Opening soon will be a 335-unit development, Southwood Del Amo, located at Crenshaw and Sepulveda Blvd.

"Our new facilities will enable us to continue to lead the building industry by building better quality homes more efficiently. Every phase of a development, from acquisition of land to finished homes ready for sale, is handled under one roof by our integrated operation. This assures buyers of our homes, high quality standards, excellent construction, a fine land value, all at the lowest cost possible," Wilson concluded.




