AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING SECTION 17.103 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE RELATIVE TO THE TRUCKING AND ROUTE ORDINANCE FOR TRUCKS USED TO TRANSPORT MATERIAL MINED WITHIN THE CITY. The City Council of the City of Torrance, California, do hereby enact the following Ordinance: SECTION 1. That Section 17.103 of the Code of the City of Torrance, California, be amended to read as follows: "Section 17.103. Exceptions."

The general prevailing rates for overtime work in said locality for each craft or type of workman needed to execute said contract are determined to be as follows: CARPENTERS—Double time for all overtime. CEMENT MASONS—Time and one-half for the first three hours after the regular duty shift, and all other overtime shall be double time. LABORERS—TRUCK DRIVERS AND OPERATING ENGINEERS—Time and one-half except Sunday and holidays which are double time. ALL OTHER CRAFTS AND TYPES OF WORKMEN—Time and one-half times said prevailing hourly rate of wage.

Said rates are determined to be the general prevailing rates for working time on Sundays and the following seven legal holidays, to wit: New Year's Day, Decoration Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Armistice Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. If any of the above named holidays occur on Sunday, the Monday next succeeding shall be considered a legal holiday. It shall be mandatory upon the contractor to whom the contract is awarded and any subcontractor under him to pay not less than the said specified prevailing rate of wages to all workmen employed by them in the execution of the contract.
