## BEST BUYS FOR THE WEEK

In Torrance Markets

California is the leading state in vegetable production... both for fresh market and processed. Almost a third of the vegetables for the nation came from California fields.

With a few exceptions we now have a fine selection of produce in our markets in spite of cold.

Artichokes will be in short supply for a few weeks, but coming from the same district you will find some quality Brussels Sprouts.

Broccoli varies from fair to good, and not quite as plentiful as we expect it at this time of year.

The old standbys, cabbage, carrots and celery are plentiful, but you'll note cabbage is creeping up a bit in price... at wholesale.

Onions are one of the budget-stretchers. Next time you have an oven dinner bake sliced onions and whole carrots in a casserole. Season with salt, pepper, butter and a little honey. Use only enough water to cook the vegetables well.

Potatoes... white, sweets and yams, are at the peak of season.

Squash. Banana squash is abundant. Bake or steam it. Serve mashed or on half shell. Season with butter, salt, and a

little molasses and cinnamon. Tomatoes. If you must have fresh tomatoes for your menus, check the small sizes... considerably less expensive than the large ones.

Avocados. The record harvest continues with prices holding low. We can all keep on serving avocados. In fact, now is the time to try all those recipes you've been hoarding for years.

Citrus Fruit. Watch for "specials". Appetites are keen for these refreshing fruits... it always happens when the flu bug appears. But growers are sending in ample supplies of small oranges, sweet-tart grapefruit, and juicy lemons.

Pears. It's mostly Anjou and Nelis this week. The Nelis is the squat, tawny russet pear. When flecks of gold appear in the skin the fruit is ripening.

## When firm it is a perfect pear for baking.

### PROTEIN FOODS

No "dramatic" changes at the meat counters. You can still depend on the poultry industry to bring you economy meals. Fryers and stewing chickens lead the field of budget buys. There's still plenty of nutritious pork; this is the time of year lamb increases in supply. Beef is welcome at any time, and expected to be about 10% more plentiful than a year ago.


