



First 'Shoestring Strip' Street Improvement Contract Awarded

First of several street improvement contracts expected in the Torrance Shoestring Strip during 1960, has been awarded, according to Councilman John S. Gibson.

Improvement of Denker St. from 227th to 228th St. is provided for in a contract granted to Progressive Paving Co. of Los Angeles. Low bid on the project was \$9886, which is approximately 10 per cent less than city engineers estimated.

THIS IMPROVEMENT will eliminate a serious drainage problem along Denker St. as well as provide a solution to the annual "lake" caused by impounded rain waters each winter.

In announcing the award of the contract, Councilman Gibson also noted adoption of the Ordinance of Intention for the improvement of the 206th and Harvard Improvement District, which will be the largest single job ever attempted in the "Strip" area.

REPORT ON work accomplished during 1959 and prospects for 1960, will be presented at the annual dinner meeting of district advisory committees on Jan. 28 in San Pedro. In this report, Gibson details the expenditures of \$1,030,834 which represents the total improvement program in his council district for 1959.
